Loose Change Entertainment, LLC Expands from Television to Feature Films

The idea for Loose Change Entertainment's flagship television program, *The Loose Change Show*, was born out of a love of sketch comedy and a name gleaned from a pile of coins on a barroom table. Eight year and 75 episodes later, television turned out not to be enough to satisfy the film bug in LCE's founding members.

The founding trio (Dan Corrigan, John F. Kerr, and Jeff Priskorn) incorporated Loose Change Entertainment LLC in 2001, and they began writing and producing feature films immediately.

More than 75 episodes of the award-winning Loose Change Show have aired locally, nationally and internationally since 1996. Two skits even made an appearance on the UK's "World's Weirdest Television."

LCE released its first feature film production, "Arbor Daze," in 2001. "Arbor Daze" is the story of a wealthy environmentalist's secluded campground whose campers disappear unexpectedly over the course of a weekend retreat. Kerr's concept of an Arbor Day based horror film, a spoof of holiday-themed horror

flicks, was interesting, but it took the addition of Corrigan's environmental know how to make the storyline unique. Kerr wrote the script, Corrigan added the twist, and Priskorn provided assistance in making it all come together. Corrigan, Kerr and Priskorn all co-directed.

In 2003, Priskorn and fellow LCTV cast member Jacquie Floyd adapted her play "Love & Plutonium" into a screenplay, and the second LCE film production was born. "Love & Plutonium" is a unique and sensational superhero story whose comic book characters come to life and discover evil in unforeseen places. Priskorn and Floyd played supporting roles, and Priskorn directed the comedy.

Production was stepped up in 2004, when less than six months after principal photography ended for "L&P," LCE's third film "Weenie Roast Massacre" entered pre-production. Kerr wrote and will direct "WRM." "Weenie Roast Massacre" is the story of the mental unraveling of a former star athlete at the annual family weenie roast. The young man's friends and former teammates start ending up dead at the same time he begins his descent into madness. Is he to blame?

Loose Change Entertainment is an independent multimedia production company based in Berkley, Michigan. LCE is co-owned by Dan Corrigan, John F. Kerr, and Jeff Priskorn.
